

How women are flipping the switch and redefining what it means to be a women in Hip-Hop

Hip-hop is still a man's game, no doubt about it. It's centered around being tough, aggressive, and masculine. Because of this, female rappers have a tough time breaking through and finding major success. Since the beginning, women in hip-hop have been exploited and sexualized, not just in lyrics but in music videos too. In her article on the evolution of black female rap, Nataki Goodall points out that rap music by men has mostly ignored women or treated them like objects for male pleasure (Goodall, 85). This kind of misogyny is yet another hurdle for women to overcome if they want to make it big in the hip-hop world.

Despite these challenges, female rappers are still killing it. They use their music to address gender issues and flip the script on the way women are portrayed in hip-hop. They're not just breaking barriers; they're redefining what it means to be a woman in the industry. Leading the pack, we've got Nicki Minaj, Cardi B, Megan Thee Stallion, and the City Girls. These ladies took that whole "sex-object" thing and flipped it around. They leaned into a raunchier style, perfect for parties and solo shower concerts, bringing in that much-needed female perspective in music about sex. These fierce women have kicked off a new era of femaleled hip-hop, flaunting their status, playing men, owning their sexuality, and looking fabulous while doing it.

Take the 2023 Rolling Loud festival, for example. Out of 108 artists, only 20 were female. while most of the headliners were men (Playboi Carti, Travis Scott, A\$AP Rocky). The women were the ones who stole the show. Some of these women include Ice Spice, Coi Leroy, Latto and Flo Milli (Billboard)

It's definitely a step in the right direction, but it's kinda disappointing when you realize how long these women have been in the game. The rise of this new wave of female rappers marks a big shift in the industry. They're reclaiming their sexuality and gender identity, breaking expectations, and taking control to change the narrative around female representation in hiphop.


